Mosquitoes can spread diseases like dengue, Zika and chikungunya.



Old tires may catch fire and create toxic fumes.



## Return **Your Tires**

It is illegal to throw them away.

(State law: HRS §Chapter 342I, Part II)

The final price of tires includes fees for proper disposal of old tires.

Take old tires to retailers, authorized recyclers or collection facilities.
