<u>Free Residential Household Hazardous Waste</u> Collection Event Information

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) collection events will be held between 7:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. on the following **new** dates and at **new** locations:

- Saturday, August 3, 2019, at the Francis Wong Baseball Stadium Parking Lot (entry via Manono Street)
- Saturday, August 10, 2019, at the Kealakehe High School Parking Lot (entry via Pū'ohulihuli Street)

The County of Hawai'i's Department of Environmental Management holds these regular collection events, at no charge to the public, so households can conveniently dispose of acceptable household hazardous waste in a manner that protects both public health and the environment.

These events are for household-generated and self-hauled waste **only**. Business, government agency, non-profit agency, or farm wastes are not allowed. <u>No</u> latex paint, no electronic waste, and no tires will be accepted.

Acceptable household hazardous waste includes automotive fluids, used batteries, fluorescent bulbs, and pesticides. Reusable latex paint will be <u>not</u> be accepted at the Hilo and Kailua-Kona events.
