Do not throw them
in the trash.

Event Safety Rules:

- * Remain in your vehicle
- * Six feet separation
- * Items in trunk or truck bed, preferably labeled.
- * Spill/Leak-proof containers
- * No container returns

If you need an auxiliary aid/service or other accommodation due to a disability, contact Chris at 961-8554 as soon as possible, preferably no later than five business days before the scheduled event. Requests made as early as possible have a greater likelihood of being fulfilled. Upon request, this notice is available in alternate/accessible formats.



ACCEPTED

- * automotive fluids (10 gallon limit)
- * corrosives
- * batteries - alkaline, NiCad, NiMH, lithium (no PV or EV), lead-acid (automotive & UPS)
- * flammable liquids and propane
- * unbroken fluorescent bulbs, and ballasts with label stating "PCB"
- * mercury thermometers
- * unused or outdated prescription medications
- * toxic aerosol canisters
- * oil-based or lead-based paint, varnishes, stains, preservatives & removers
- * toxic garden supplies- herbicides, pesticides, insecticides and fungicides
- * household poison- insecticides, bug spray, household rodenticide
- * "photoelectric" smoke detectors
- * miscellaneous- drain cleaners, pool chemicals, bleach.

NOT ACCEPTED

- * waste from businesses, farms, government agencies and non-profit organizations
- * electronic waste
- * water-based paints (e.g. latex and acrylic)
- * fire extinguishers. gas cylinders/ canisters greater than 5 gallons or containing industrial-use gases (e.g. acetylene)
- * fertilizers and restricted use pesticides
- * used cooking oil
- * fluorescent light ballasts made after 1998 (no PCBs and considered scrap metal)
- * biological or infectious waste
- * controlled substances (drugs)
- * electronic smoking devices
- * explosive, reactive, radioactive & shock sensitive materials including ionization smoke detectors (states "ionization" or "americium 241" sensor)
- * tires
- * large quantities of any material or greater than normal household quantities
- * non-hazardous materials such as soaps and empty gas and propane cylinders/ canisters (the latter should be taken to an authorized scrap metal recycler.
- * other restrictions apply.
